I am requesting funding for Austin Community Violence Intervention in Fiscal Year 2026. The entity to receive funding for this project is the City of Austin, located at 301 West Second Street, Second Floor, Austin, TX 78701.

This funding would be used to Austin Public Health (APH) will use the requested funds to continue our Community Violence Intervention programming to individuals who are at highest risk of being impacted by community violence in crime hotspot locations. This program uses street outreach, conflict mediation, wraparound services, and community engagement to provide much needed support and services to individuals and neighborhoods promoting equity and positively impacting the community to reduce acts of violence, enhance cohesion, and actualize peace. This project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because, like other cities in the United States, Austin experienced a sharp increase in homicides since the COVID-19 pandemic, with the current homicide rate far exceeding pre-pandemic numbers. These incidents of gun violence are disproportionately impacting communities who have historically experience segregation and divestment.

The project has a Federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes authorized by section 501 of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C. Section 10152).
